PRINCIPAL NOTE

Jesus Cleanses Ten Lepers

11 jOn the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. 12 And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance 13 and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." 14 When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. 15 Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; 16 and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. 17 Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? 18 Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" 19 And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well." Luke 17:11-19

Every night before bed I ask my children three questions for prayer, one of which is: "What are you thankful for?" Typically, answers don't vary much from "my toys", or "yummy food". If I am lucky they may even say "my dad!". Oftentimes I find myself frustrated at the limited answers they give, and want to open their eyes to how blessed they are. As I look at the account of the ten lepers and reflect on this, even in my own life, it makes me realize that a lack of thankfulness is something we as sinful humans struggle with. Despite the fact that we know the one leper who gave thanks worshiped the Lord rightly, we more readily identify ourselves with the other nine, we more often than not find ourselves as one of 'the nine'.

What impedes our ability to respond with gratitude? And how can we cultivate hearts of thankfulness? It beings with mercy

And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." The ten lepers recognized that Jesus was the only one that could heal them. They went out of their way from their lives in exile to find Jesus because they had heard about the miracles he had performed. Jesus saw them and listened to their cries for mercy. Similarly, Jesus offers us mercy from the sin that separates us from God through his death and resurrection. It is this foundation that our thanksgiving is built upon. We should never tire of the beauty of this gospel truth, and it should bolster our faith and renew our attitude towards everything. It is only because of God's mercy to us that we can 'give thanks in all circumstances' (1 Thessalonians 5:8) and 'give thanks always and for everything' (Ephesians 5:20).

Stop and focus on who God is

When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. The ten lepers did what Jesus told them to, they left. Can you imagine their excitement as they left and were cleansed? All the things they had missed in exile for so long were waiting for them as they walked away. What they were doing wasn't wrong, but it wasn't right either. In their excitement and enjoyment they missed something even better—the chance to thank Him, to praise God, to show love and gratitude and happiness. Just a slight detour would have made the experience so much better, as they would have joyfully been in Jesus' presence. Too often, we miss out on giving thanks because our focus is in the wrong place. Instead of focusing on Jesus we are focused on our circumstances. This limits our thankfulness in a few ways: we are tempted to believe that we had a part to play in his blessings, we are thankful only when things are going well, or we have short memories of his goodness. So stop, take the detour, take time to focus on who God is and meditate on what he has done, and let your thankfulness flow from this. The reward is His presence, which is worth much more than the physical healing itself. The miracles of the New Testament are meant to point us to the Healer who can give us everlasting life.

Be thankful in the work of God's goodness

Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. The leper that did choose to turn back wasn't shy about expressing his gratitude. He saw the evidence of God's goodness in his life and his thankfulness was expressed in praise. This should be true of our lives as well. When God's goodness is evident in our life we shouldn't keep quiet. We must praise God for what he has done and continues to do. In doing this, God gets the glory and honour that he deserves.

The story of the ten lepers teaches us that God's mercy should lead us to thankfulness. We are saved, and our response to salvation should always be gratitude in all circumstances. It also reminds us to stop and be thankful for God's presence. Finally, it is an encouragement to turn our thanksgiving into praise, because He is worthy of everyone's worship.

Every night before bed I ask my children 3 questions for prayer: what is something you are thankful for? What is something or someone we need to pray for? What do we need to ask for forgiveness for?
